
## THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS

- Launched our new Survivor Circle ministry, welcoming 28 sexual abuse survivors and 7 loved ones of victim-survivors into monthly online gatherings for ongoing community and support
- Published 40 informative blog posts, including the first three profiles in our new monthly Survivor Story feature
- Helped educate many supportive clergy and lay ministers in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and throughout the United States
- Hosted 5 powerful Courageous Conversations, on topics like "Trauma and Resilience in the Body of Christ" and "Why the Church Needs Survivors' Stories"
- Followed each of these thought-provoking presentations with an evening of small group discussion and community building the subsequent week
- Increased our social media outreach through an active presence on Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, and YouTube
- Engaged many new local and remote volunteers to share their time and gifts in support of Awake's mission
- Offered 5 unique prayer services, including our powerful "Walking the Way of the Cross with Survivors" online service during Lent
- Invited 21 volunteers to deepen their understanding of and commitment to our mission at our second annual Awake Leadership Gathering
- Deepened our relationships and collaboration with other lay advocacy groups in the United States and Canada
- Participated in the global Catholic synod process by hosting two virtual Synod Sessions with 106 participants, including 46 abuse survivors, and submitted our report to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

## **INCOME\***


